

Landscape Summary Report for 4767 Pilot House Road

Our objective is to carry the character charm of the renovated house into the garden and to remain in keeping with the neighbourhood and surrounding natural features. This will be achieved by:

- Leaving the exiting property line hedges intact including the hedge that borders Pilot House Road. Additional lilacs will be added to the existing single lilac in order to bring attention to the pedestrian entrance.
- With the owner's interest in geology, we are re-using any/all rock from the excavation either as features or for terracing. All terracing will be kept to a minimum, be dry stacked and staggered to provide habitat and be secondary to the planting.
- All pedestrian pathways will continue to be pea gravel and natural stone where grade changes are required.
- Re-using as many of the existing plants that can be transplanted as possible. Additional planting
 will include several small trees and a mix of perennials and shrubs (some of which will be native)
 to create a soft, naturalistic planting typical of what would be associated with a character home.
 The estimated height of the selected trees at maturity is 20 to 25 feet.
