
Purpose of the Pedestrian Network Study

Better maintain sidewalks and paths


Improve Comfort: add lighting, amenities

Current Sidewalk Network



Data on Sidewalk Network

Road Class	No Sidewalk	Sidewalk on one side	Sidewalks on both sides	Total
Arterial (high volume)	47%	29%	25%	100%
Collector (med volume)	60%	35%	6%	100%
Local (low volume)	91%	6%	3%	100%

53% of arterial streets – sidewalks on at least one side

40% of collector streets – sidewalks on at least one side

9% of local streets – sidewalks on at least one side

Sidewalks generally placed on one side of major roads, unless in areas zoned multi-family or commercial



What types of improvements will be implemented on the Pedestrian Network?



Not just sidewalks!

There are a variety of options for improving walking routes.

Improvements to routes with **medium to high vehicle traffic volumes**, in school zones, or close to popular destinations could include:


- Sidewalks and multi-use pathways;
- New crosswalks;
- Pedestrian signals;
- Traffic calming;
- Removal of overgrowth and foliage, and
- Pedestrian lighting

Improvements to local roads with low traffic volumes could include:

- Constructing gravel pathways on street shoulders
- Removal of foliage and overgrowth
- Creating urban connector trails to cross creeks and ravines in order to better connect neighbourhoods
- Pedestrian lighting








