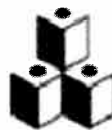

North Shore Housing Forum May 27-28 2009

The forum, organized and hosted by three North Shore community groups (Community Housing Action Committee, Lionsview Housing Planning Committee, and Canadian Federation of University Women) will be held at the Leo Marshall Curriculum Centre, on the evening of Wednesday, May 27, and all day Thursday, May 28.

The purpose of the forum is to engage citizens in planning their own sustainable communities, and aims to look for solutions to the current housing crisis. The forum has received funding from the City of North Vancouver and BC Housing. Districts of North and West Vancouver, as well as North Shore Community Resources, are supporting the initiative by providing expertise and staff.

The forum will open with a keynote speech by Michael Geller, and internationally renowned architect, planner and real estate consultant. The program also includes presentations by the North Shore Mayors, along with panel discussions involving key players in the housing market. The forum agenda aims to offer residents an opportunity to say what they want for their own communities, identify major challenges and look at ways to design joint solution strategies.
