I am writing to you all to present a few key points regarding the proposed pickleball courts at GECC.

However, before I do so, I would like to address a major concern about the proposal to remove the skateboard park and replace it with a pump track. In a false and misleading article in the Northshore News, written by Nick Laba on March 21, 2025, Ryan Taylor stated that the proposed GECC pickleball courts would be replacing the existing skateboard park. At no point did the West Vancouver Players suggest the removal of the skateboard bowl. In fact, a working group was convened to review the three option proposal that Parks developed (which made no reference to the removal of the skateboard park or the development of a pumptrack) and it provided its recommendations to the Roundtable at the end of last year. The recommendation that was presented to Council by Jill Lawlor at its last meeting was vastly amended unilaterally by Parks to include a pump track and remove the skateboard bowl. It is extremely inflammatory to pit two groups against each other, when both groups can coexist on the same grounds. This has created an unnecessary problem in your attempts to meet the needs of West Vancouver tax-paying residents.

Now to the key points of why GECC is the right location for the proposed outdoor pickleball courts:

The western part of the District currently has no local outdoor pickleball courts. This site is the only potential location for courts in the area. It ticks of many boxes why the courts should be built there.

- Facilities can be easily accessed by all ages
- Ample parking is available
- Public Transit stops at GECC
- Access to Washrooms, a Cafe, Gathering Places to socialize after play
- School children can use the facility for lessons
- Investing in these courts align with West Vancouver's commitment to healthy communities, inclusive, recreation, and sustainable infrastructure
- Horseshoe Bay is undergoing revitalization, bringing more residents who will benefit from nearby courts for recreation, social connection, and healthy living

Furthermore, this brings me to the most important point:

- In case of an emergency, GECC has 3 AED's in the Community Center and the West Vancouver Fire and Rescue Department is right next to the proposed pickleball courts. That will provide our seniors and anyone with a heart condition with the reassurance that help can be provided fast.

The current landscape:

We currently have two outdoor courts in West Vancouver solely dedicated for outdoor pickleball play. Normanby has proven to be incredibly successful and has attracted a massive crowd, but it has its limitations. The courts can only be accessed by car and the steep driveway to the courts are not possible to walk up by some of our players. It has only outdoor toilets, no running water and no AED.

Ambleside courts are a good addition to support the eastern end of the district. However, it is fraught with issues relating to my experience playing there. It has not been a positive one and I am not alone in this statement. I have heard numerous stories of groups not wanting to play with certain players and players cutting in in front of others. West Vancouverites have felt like outsiders. Adding more courts there will help residents from Downtown and the Northshore not the West Vancouver Community. Ambleside has other challenges in the busy summer month as well. Parking during markets and festivals will be a nightmare.

I would like to end my letter in highlighting to Council how pickleball has brought our Community closer and made it stronger. Playing with new partners all the time is like Community Speed Dating. You are on your best behaviour, trying to get to know and work with your partner. New pickleball courts will benefit residents of all ages, backgrounds and abilities. It is a fun way for seniors to stay active, independent and interact with their Community. I hope Council will support the proposed outside courts at GECC. Thank you.

I am a West Vancouver resident and have been a Pickleball player [REDACTED] s. 22(1).

I wish to state that I am not in favour of the proposal to remove the bike/skate bowl and replace them with a pump track and four outdoor pickleball courts at Gleneagles. There has been local publicity about pickleball displacing other user groups. This, together with the ongoing noise concerns, is not good for our sport.

The four new courts at Ambleside are wonderful, I love playing there – thank you! However, they have not been finished. Outstanding work includes paving the apron, installing the bleachers, paddle holders and bike racks. The playing surface is continually damaged by players' shoes tracking stones into the courts. Daily cleaning by player volunteers helps, but inevitably the courts will need to be resurfaced earlier if the apron is not paved.

May I request that priority be given to four more courts at Ambleside to create a pickleball hub. Several of my pickleball friends have stated a preference for one larger, centralized location, maybe even with a roof that would allow for pickleball play all year-round. If not at Ambleside, then perhaps Hugo Ray Park could be looked at again.

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Dear Mayor Sager and Council,

I am writing to express my support for the long-awaited GE outdoor pickleball courts in the area adjacent to the current skate bowl area on the GE community Centre site.

We have been through an exhaustive search for appropriate locations in the western end of the district for some years now.

This location, as you know, ticks all the boxes, particularly the noise factor associated with our sport.

If we end up **without** the 'adventure park' proposed by parks, we request that you consider utilizing the allotted funds to provide some level of protective covering on the courts (whatever is the most economical). We did not push for it in our original design proposal because we were aware of funding limitations. However, our demand for court time exceeds the supply each day at both GE and West Van Rec Centres. Covered courts would enable us to extend play outdoors even during inclement weather and remove some of the pressure for indoor spaces. This would be a good long-term investment!

Also, just to clarify, the players in West Vancouver, never proposed displacing any other sport currently utilizing any sport asset on the proposed site. Although we are supportive of other sports, we are concerned that non residents should have any say in the prioritizing of, and construction of, assets and amenities in the District that are supported by West Van Resident tax dollars. Priority setting should be the purview of our Council based on its needs, priorities and longer- term planning. I am concerned that the opposition to the current proposal for courts (with the pump track on the skate board bowl) will unduly delay construction of same; and sincerely request that we stick with the timeline that Council has articulated for moving this project forward.

Thank you for your continued support of our sport and am glad to help in whatever way we can, to move this project forward. This project has brought our pickleball community in the west end of the district closer, as we engaged with so many neighbours, players and interested parties. This sport continues to facilitate social interaction amongst our most marginalized seniors who make an effort to play and who are welcomed by the rest of us.

It should not be a question of maintaining the existing skateboard park versus building pickleball courts. There is a large area of parking right adjacent to the skateboard park that is under-utilized. The greatest amount of parking used by the Recreation centre is between the Recreation Centre and the Golf Center, Great Hall and Orchard Restaurant. Undeveloped parking is available to the north of the golf course and between Marine drive which is more central to the existing parking used by the golfers, recreation centre and restaurant. Dear Mayor and Council,

We are writing in support of the construction of pickleball courts at Gleneagles adjacent to the skate bowl area and the vacant unused bike park, both of which Parks have confirmed remain unused.

After the two Open Houses held in West Vancouver this week, we would like to express our concern about the following key points:

1. West Van Players have been advocating for, and working within, the Parks planning framework for new courts, since 2023. A working group of community residents who are also pickleball players reviewed three options (see designs attached) presented to us by Parks. The proposal was to construct courts in an area away from residences and co-located with GE community Centre so that amenities can be shared and efficiencies realized. Through a consultative process, we prioritized our preference for four courts, which were reviewed by the round table and scaled down to three courts and unanimously supported.

We are grateful that as part of the 'Adventure park' option that Parks have now presented, that we have 4 courts back into the design. Regardless of what is finally selected as the go-forward plan, our preference is for four courts on that footprint of land and kindly request that Council consider same.

2. Although the current proposal by Parks of four courts and a pump track is most impressive, it is important to understand that our proposal as originally configured, did not propose displacing the skateboard bowl. Nonetheless, the outpouring of support from many skateboarders who do NOT reside in West Vancouver, is disturbing. Our sports facility priorities should be driven by our Community and the Districts' overall plan for amenities using its limited spaces and resources, not by people looking to maintain a highly underutilized amenity and get it revamped at West Van taxpayers' expense.

However, if in its wisdom the District feels it wishes to refurbish the facility, then that is a separate project for study which needs to undergo the same rigour that we have had to face for several years now. We are deeply concerned that the expanded proposal may delay approval and construction of our long-awaited courts. Council has committed the funds, we have engaged the community in the planning, and we have worked with Parks and Council to make it happen! We trust that you will follow up with the schedule on these courts as committed and in a timely way.

We thank you for your continued support of our growing sport which clearly meets our community's needs to remain healthy, less isolated and helps strengthen our community.

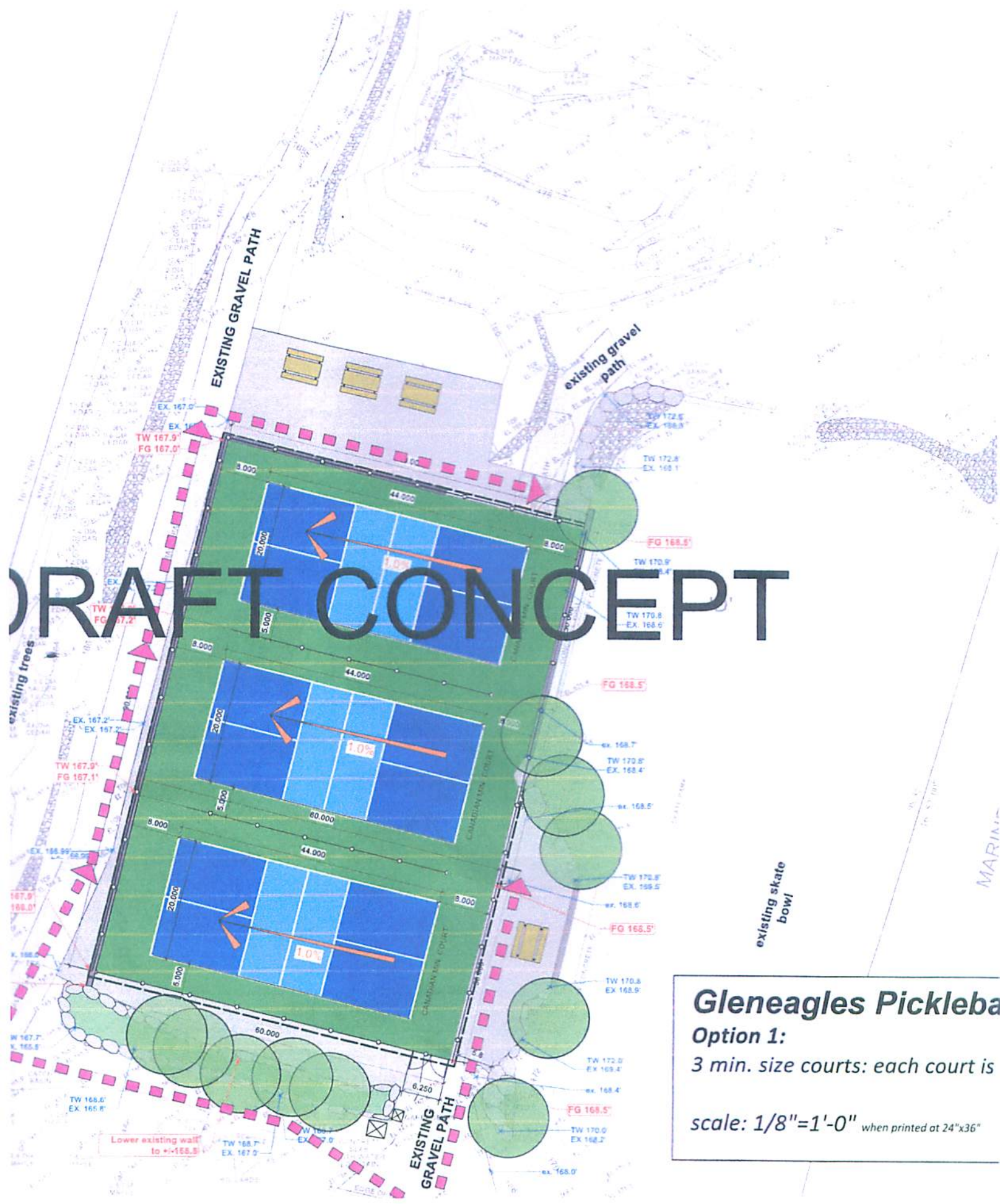

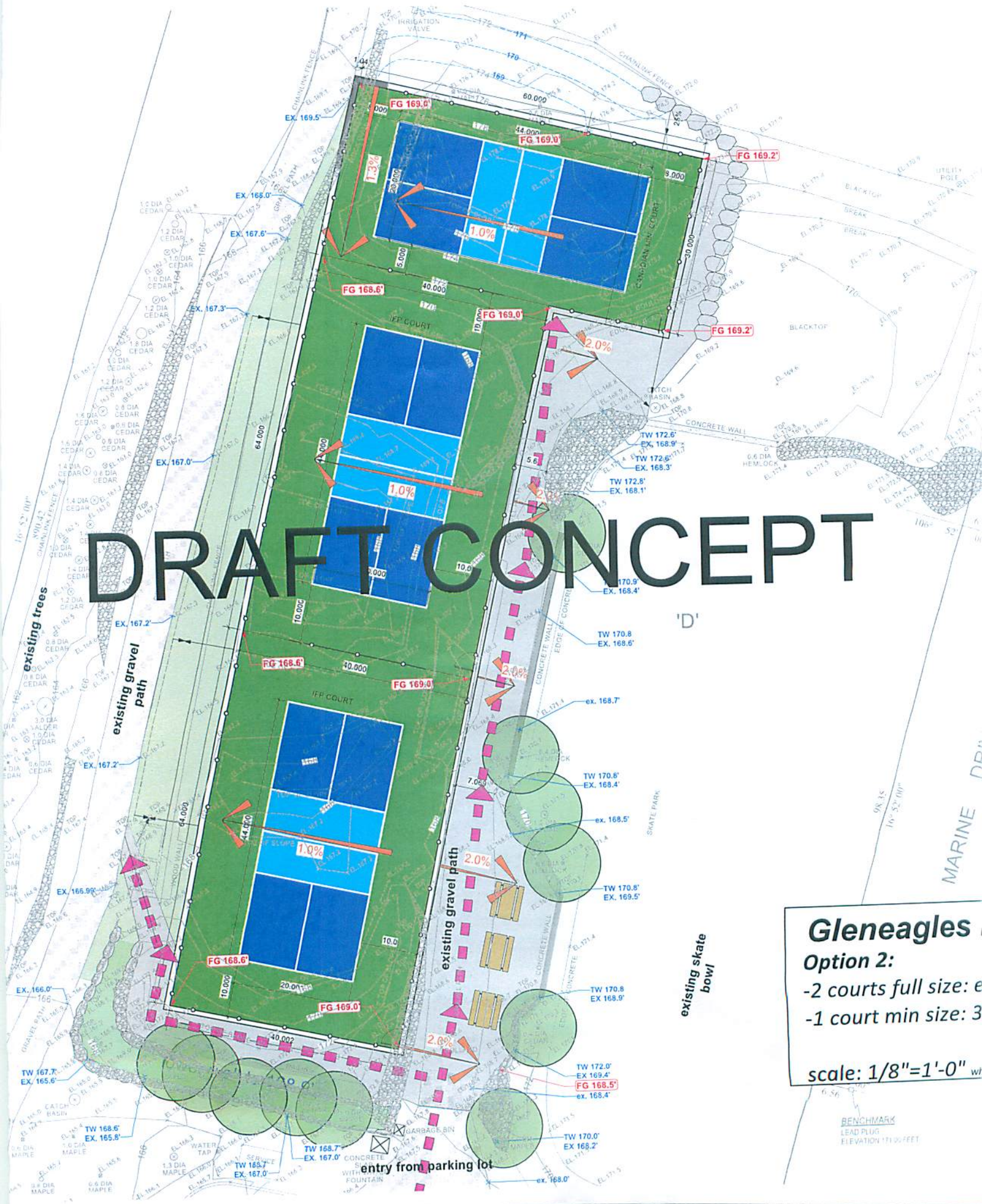

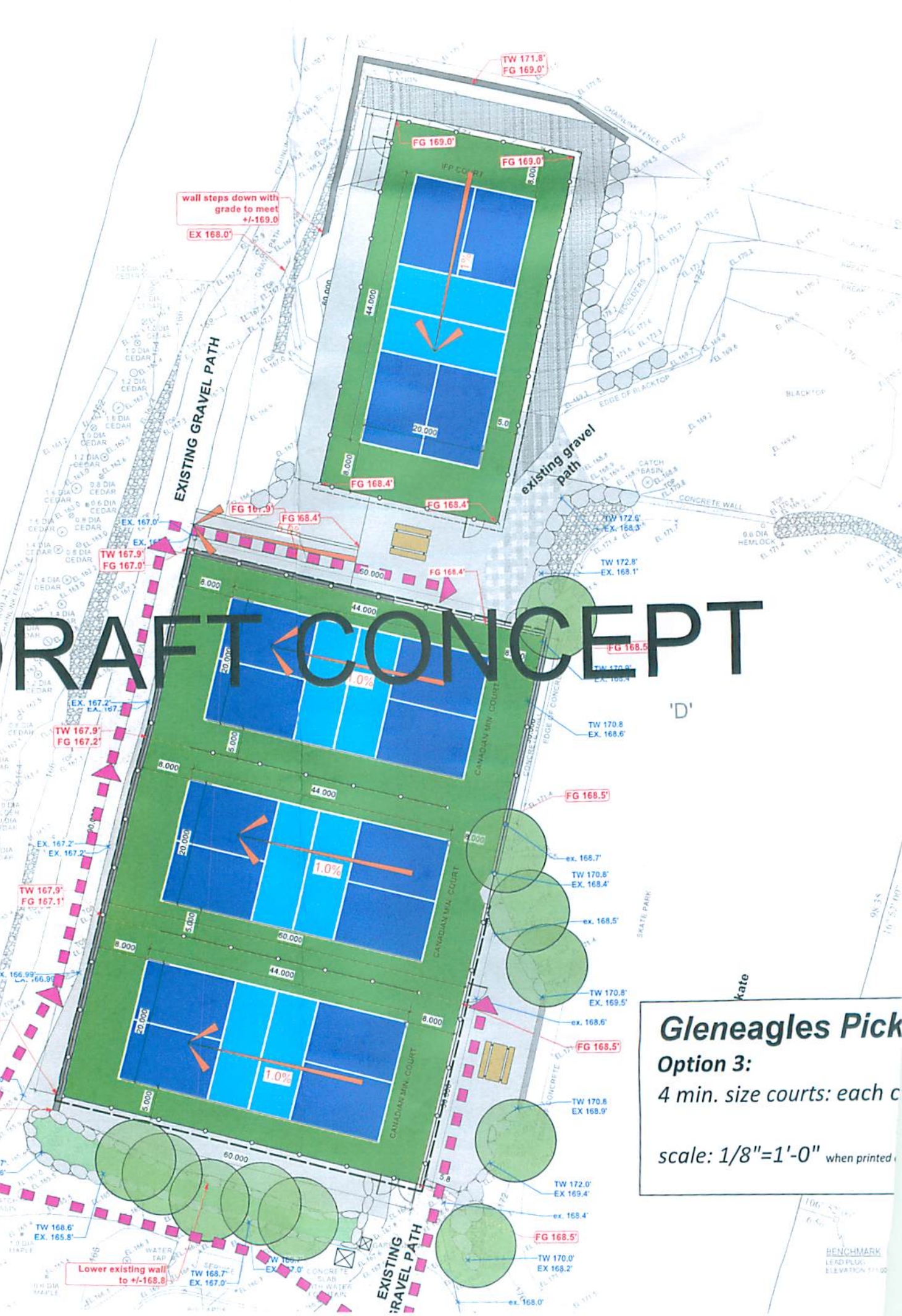

I am a long term resident of West Vancouver and pickleball player.

I grew up in West Vancouver and have been a consistent user of the parks and recreation facilities; I do not belong to a private club. I live in the Caulfeild/Gleneagles area and I am an active user of the Gleneagles recreation facilities.

I fully support the proposal put forward last year for four new courts at Gleneagles; they are needed for the demand of this growing sport and will be a positive addition to the existing recreation facilities in the western corridor of our community.

Outdoor courts at Gleneagles would provide:

- An outdoor pickleball facility for the western half of West Vancouver
- Players would use facilities from the Gleneagles Community Centre and expand its use and revenue
- Expanded facilities for the adjacent school
- Provide support for the growing need for more pickleball courts in West Vancouver

Last year Parks made a proposal which included a number of options. From there, a working group of local residents together with West Van Players selected option 3, which included four community sized courts. This was subsequently changed to a three court option (to include standard sized courts) and it was then unanimously approved by the Pickleball Advisory Round Table. None of the proposed options affected the existing skate bowl.

My concern with the current proposal by Parks, ie removing the skate bowl, building four pickleball courts and constructing a pump track, has complicated the project and has brought forward skate board bowl protests.

I support the Pickleball court construction project with either of the following options :

- leave the skate board bowl in place and proceed with the three or preferably four court option approved last year and with funds in place.
- Proceed with the latest proposal ie four pickleball courts, a pump track (skate board bowl removal) as the skate board facility has been underused for years and many of the protestors appear to be non residents of West Vancouver.

In summary, I strongly support the construction of pickleball courts at Gleneagles and request an early decision be made to avoid delays in their construction.

I'm a West Vancouver resident and a member of the North Shore Pickleball Club. There are many rumours about the proposed new courts at Gleneagles. As I understand it, the bike community doesn't want to lose their bowls so the group known as the West Van Players is now advocating for 3 courts (2 regulation and 1 small) on that site.

As a taxpayer, I believe building 3 courts at Gleneagles for some \$500,000 (\$166k/court) is not financially responsible. If Council chooses to go with the pump track and 4 court option the cost of removing the bike bowls will be astronomical.

Building 4 courts at Ambleside last year cost \$350,000 (\$90k/court) and there is some finishing left to do there. I would like Council to step back, and seriously look at putting the remaining money allocated to pickleball into building 4 more courts at Ambleside and finishing the existing 4. I've heard the arguments that Council wants a full plan for Ambleside first and that there may be hog fuel under the extended site. In the 30 years I've lived here, the Ambleside plan has been talked about and never completed. The site is a parking lot and fully packed down. Please consider where Council and the community can get the most resources for our investment, and make the financially responsible decision.

We appreciate your ongoing efforts to support recreational opportunities in our community. After a thorough review of potential locations for dedicated Pickleball courts in the Horseshoe Bay area, the underutilized Gleneagles Bike Skills area remains the most suitable option.

- The site meets key criteria: no noise impact on neighbors, convenient parking, proximity to GECC facilities, and access to first aid at the nearby firehall.
- A large number of local players (over 200) participate weekly in drop-in programs at GECC, with demand exceeding availability. These programs generate significant revenue, especially during non-prime hours.
- Gleneagles PAC fully supports the courts, recognizing their value in encouraging students to engage in a lifelong recreational activity.
- The western part of West Vancouver currently has no dedicated courts, while other areas have multiple facilities. This project would provide much-needed access for local residents.

As a nearby neighbor for over [REDACTED] s. 22(1), first we say a big YAY! It is great news that you'll take the opportunity to turn it into something more useful and esthetically pleasing.

We fully support your thinking around considering diverse, affordable, seniors housing, and especially adding more rental stock. [REDACTED] s. 22(1), but like the idea that many next generations who can't afford to buy in Vancouver can at least live where they've grown up. We'd also LOVE to take any cars off the road of people who have to commute over one of the clogged up bridges.

Less interesting is strata, as it seems there is a fair amount of stock currently, but staff may have different views/perspectives.

In the article it quoted Coun. Cassidy's suggestion of going higher than 8 stories. It may be contrary to some opinions, but we would 100% support building higher. District land is scarce and this type of housing stock is scarce and it feels not as attractive to developers, so the added density would benefit. I'll bet you'd like to avoid a prolonged public feedback process (understandably) and don't quite understand how much leeway you can grant outside LAP, but it would be worth getting more density that would benefit residents for years to come. And hopefully based on its location, it wouldn't have too many opposing the idea.

Personally, [REDACTED] s. 22(1), we also hope that there will be more co-ops available so we can enjoy in our golden years the equity we've built in our home. Just an idea for consideration, if there's other opportunities in front of you. We have looked at 3 co-op developments but they come up for sale so rarely, we are not feeling confident that it will be an option purely from a supply/demand perspective.

Dear Mayor Sager and Council Members:

We wish to draw your attention to the most deplorable conditions imaginable along the extremely well-used trail beneath the Marine Drive underpass along the Capilano river bank. We have been using this trail forever but of late, it is more akin to a ghetto than the civilized walkway of just a few years past.

[REDACTED] s.22(1) cleaning up and disposing of trash, stolen goods and other detritus left in this area. [REDACTED] s.22(1), the garbage accumulates to the point that it resembles a dumping ground.

[REDACTED] s.22(1) pick up garbage in order to keep our neighbourhood looking good. In fact, we are quite fed up and look to the District to ensure this area is kept in good order. Further, the individual who creates most of this mess, uses the area as a place to do drugs and when he is not playing with his trash, can often be found lying on the ground in a drug-induced state. Typically, this includes the lighting of fires which could easily get out of control during periods of dry weather. Attached are photos from the other day of the typical garbage left almost daily as well as of the individual high on drugs.

This portion of the Pac-Cap Trail is used by hundreds of people every day, including families with young children, teenagers, hikers, workers on their way to Amica, bicyclists trying to enjoy their day off and many seniors like ourselves. It is totally unfair that people walking along the trail beside the banks of the Capilano River have to walk through the garbage and someone high on drugs. Certainly, not something that anyone wants to be exposed to, especially young individuals.

To address this situation and discourage such behavior, large rocks or similar material should be placed on the flat bare areas at the top of the river bank as well as the area on the west side of the underpass road. Large shrubbery planted in these spots would also work to prevent access. Also, daily sweeps to remove garbage would maintain the cleanliness, and arranging for the Police to patrol the area 2-3 times a day would most likely eliminate the drug use and make the trail a pleasant experience for all. Garbage cans in this area would be appreciated, as would cleaning the street of piles of leaves and dirt from last year. The new Executive Inn strata is being advertised as sited adjacent to the tranquility and beauty of the Capilano River. I can only imagine what purchasers think when they set out to explore their new environs.

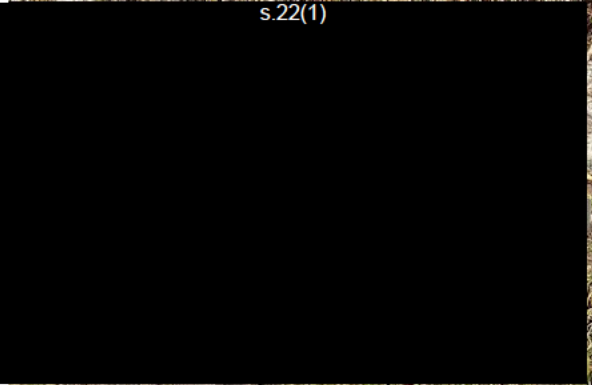
We trust that the Mayor and Council Members will prioritize addressing this matter and keep all of West Vancouver a desirable place to reside.

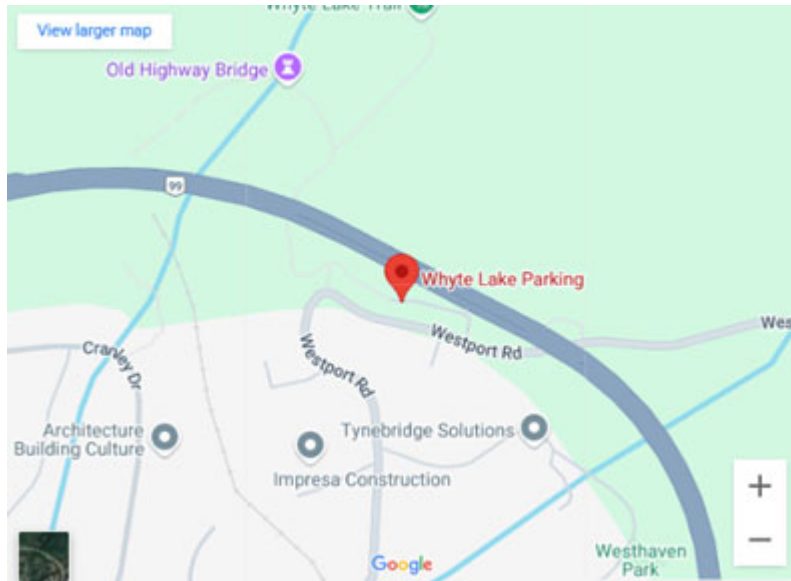
