<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	A compact deciduous magnolia with deep purple-pink outer petals and pale interiors. Blooms later than many magnolias, reducing frost damage risk.	A small ornamental tree with creamy-white bracts in late spring, attractive bark, and red fruit. Good disease resistance.	Soft pink bracts. Elegant branching and strong ornamental appeal.	Notable for its peeling cinnamon-colored bark and excellent fall color. Slow-growing and highly ornamental.	A striking cultivar with vibrant gold summer foliage and pink spring flowers that emerge before leaves.	A refined ornamental tree with camellia-like white flowers in early summer, striking exfoliating bark in shades of gray, brown, and orange, and excellent red-orange fall color. Slow-growing with a graceful, layered branching structure.	Native to the Pacific Northwest with graceful arching form and excellent fall color in reds and oranges.
