Dear Mayor and Council:

- 1) *Johnny got a mosquito bite. Later that day, he collapsed from a heart attack. He concluded that mosquito bites cause heart attacks.*

Anecdotal conclusions like these are broad judgments drawn from personal stories, isolated incidents, or small sample sizes rather than systematic research or data and lack the rigour and systematic data required to ensure validity or generalisability. I learned that in Grade 9 Science.

I am finding the pressure tactics from various sports clubs and businesses quite tiresome. I have twice been publicly and aggressively taken to task by a spokesperson for the ADBIA. Such behavior is rude and unprofessional and reflects badly on the organization. It is not a good look for their businesses and certainly does not encourage me to patronize those businesses.

There are many reasons why business is down. The uncertain economy is a big contributor. Restaurants Canada released the Q1 report last week that indicated 36% of restaurants were breaking even or losing money. Cutting corners or cutting costs, a common reaction, are not always successful. They did not mention pay-parking as a contributing factor.

As for Earl's, they have free parking but have failed numerous inspections from Vancouver Coastal Health. Perhaps their problem is not pay-parking.

I note nearby restaurants are packed for dinner service. I also do not see them speak at Council meetings. If business is down, they certainly would have extra time and impetus to do just that.

Personally, I drove down the 1400 block Bellevue on Saturday afternoon and noticed 4 empty spots – 2 on either side of the road. I was also on Lonsdale and 16th in North Vancouver one morning last week. Yes, I paid for parking and was happy to do so. Why? Because there was actually parking. Perhaps pay parking on some segments of Bellevue would solve the problem and allow for vehicle turnover.

As for the sports clubs, some indicated that they have hundreds of members who need to be there for hours. That blocks parking for park goers who then use nearby streets. Perhaps pay-parking will encourage carpooling and open up parking. If they can afford \$300. for sport specific shoes and other equipment as well as team and tournament memberships, a SUV and gas for their vehicle, surely they can afford a few bucks for pay-parking to contribute to WV expenses. I am surprised they are not embarrassed to, among other things, arrive at Council en masse to argue for free parking.

Regardless, I strongly support pay-parking to help defray the cost burden to WV taxpayers for park maintenance. If we become the only beach with free parking, WV will be overwhelmed by traffic and crowds. Increased crowds will exacerbate, not solve the parking issue and increase our maintenance costs. Attempts to strong arm the community with guerilla tactics and a single, unsubstantiated argument to get their way is not appreciated by this taxpayer.

Dear Mayor Sager and Council,

We are writing regarding the ongoing construction project at Navy Jack adjacent to our condominium building and the increasing traffic and access issues affecting residents on 18th Street.

As previously communicated many times during the approval process for this project, residents expressed serious concerns that construction activity and operation would create significant traffic and access problems on our narrow cul-de-sac. Unfortunately, these concerns are now materializing. The blocked access also interferes with essential service vehicles, including garbage and recycling collection, and could delay emergency vehicle access when required.

We respectfully request the City implement immediate measures, including:

- Installation of clear signage prohibiting construction and contractor vehicles working on the Navy site from parking on 18th Street in front of our condominium as it impacts our parking ramp/access.

- Immediate enforcement of these restrictions, as Navy Jack construction trucks are frequently blocking resident access and creating unsafe conditions. There has been several recent incidents two of which documented in the photos below.
- Strengthening the existing and hardly visible “No Stopping” signage at the foot of 18th Street, which is routinely ignored by visitors stopping to view the ocean.
- Addition of stronger wording such as “Immediate Tow Away Zone” and increased enforcement to deter illegal stopping and parking.
- Consideration of temporary construction traffic controls for the duration of the project to protect resident access and emergency vehicle movement.

These issues will foreseeably continue once the bistro opens, with food deliveries, garbage collection and recycling pickup further increasing traffic congestion and access problems on our street.

We ask that the West Vancouver City addresses these issues immediately before conditions worsen further during construction and operation.

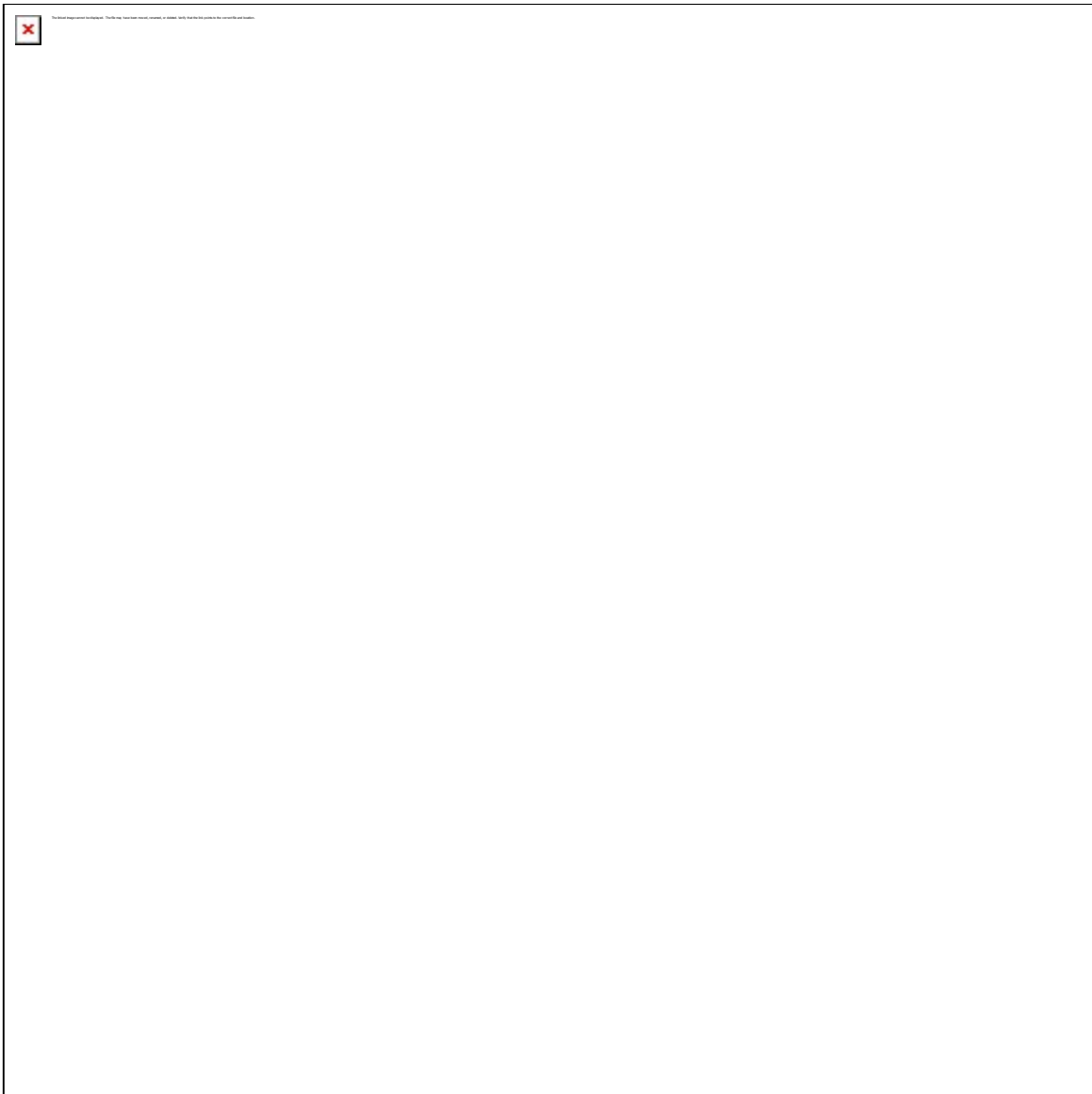

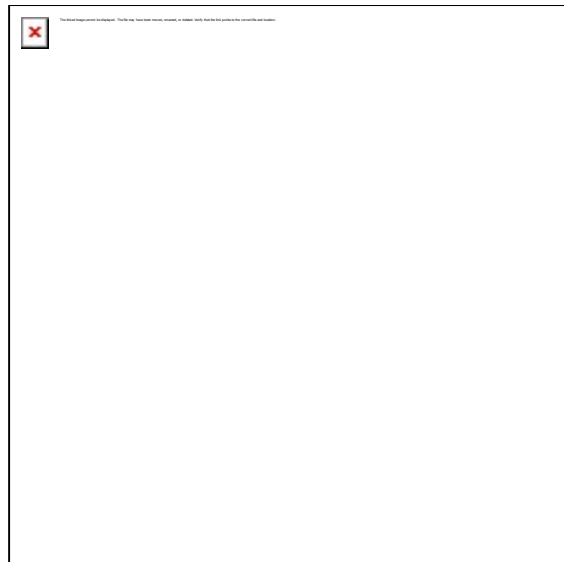

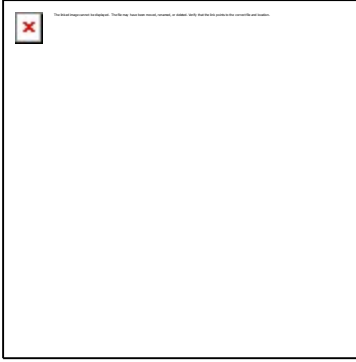

Dear Mayor, Council & Municipal Manager,

I am writing today to express my concern and disappointment regarding permitting delays related to critical infrastructure work at West Bay Elementary School.

I am the owner of a property [REDACTED] s. 22(1) in West Vancouver, and [REDACTED] s.22(1) school, West Bay Elementary, each day. It is a school that looks much the same today as it did when I was growing up in Ambleside. Recently, site preparations began for the school's long-awaited envelope and window replacement project. The school appears ready to undertake the work, with timelines carefully planned by staff and significant costs already committed. Yet despite safety fencing having been erected for well over a month, construction has still not begun.

After inquiring with school administration, the PAC was informed that permits remain delayed within the District's department, and the project is now significantly behind schedule. As a result, windows that should have been replaced during the warm and dry months will instead be installed during December and January, typically our wettest and coldest time of year. In addition to the operational challenges this creates, these delays inevitably carry financial consequences through extended site preparation, contractor scheduling impacts, and increased carrying costs, all of which ultimately place further strain on already narrow public-school budgets.

[REDACTED] s.22(1) within the District myself, I understand permitting timelines and the realities of municipal processes. I accepted those delays with the assumption that more urgent priorities were taking precedence. However, I struggle to think of infrastructure more deserving of priority than a school attended daily by hundreds of children and teachers.

This project is not cosmetic; it is necessary building infrastructure for a public elementary school. Delays will now directly impact the learning environment and wellbeing of students and staff throughout the winter months and put further strain on school resources.

I kindly request that the District urgently review the status of these permits and take whatever steps possible to expedite the process.

I am writing as a deeply concerned parent regarding the ongoing safety issues around Ambleside Park Childcare and the surrounding playground area.

Today, families received communication from the daycare regarding an incident in which an individual was found sleeping on the front porch of the childcare facility during morning drop-off hours and later became agitated, requiring police attendance. As a parent, it is extremely upsetting to hear that educators and families are repeatedly being placed in these situations.

Unfortunately, this is not an isolated incident. On a previous Sunday visit to the playground with my children, I personally witnessed an individual openly smoking what appeared to be crack near the children's play area. I immediately left because I did not feel it was safe for my children to remain there.

I understand homelessness and addiction are complex issues that require compassion and support. However, children, families, and educators also deserve safe access to schools, playgrounds, and childcare facilities without being exposed to drug use, drug paraphernalia, unsafe behaviour, or distressing situations.

It is incredibly concerning that this has apparently been an ongoing issue for years without meaningful resolution. Spaces intended for young children should feel safe and protected for the families who use them every day.

I strongly urge the District, Parks Department, and West Vancouver Police to implement increased monitoring, preventative measures, and regular patrols around Ambleside Park Childcare and nearby playground areas, particularly during early morning hours.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. I sincerely hope meaningful action is taken before a more serious incident occurs.

On Monday, May 11, there was an incident at the Childcare facility that has left an educator at the centre quite shaken up.

When she arrived at the facility, around 7:50am, there was a homeless man fast asleep on the front porch. She entered through the side door and called non emergency. The operator was asking many questions; asking for her to do a wellness check, etc. At this point all she needed was some assistance in getting the man to Leave, and did not feel comfortable going outside alone to do a check on him.

A parent arrived while she was on the phone, and then the man woke up and began to get quite agitated - banging on the glass front door (which was thankfully locked), the front deck, the railing and yelling profanities. She quickly hung up and called 9-1-1. An officer arrived quite quickly. Numerous families arrived while the situation was unravelling.

Needless to say, the educator is quite upset at having profanities yelled at her, a child was inconsolable at witnessing this take place, and families were concerned at walking into their childcare facility and finding a police officer and an aggressive homeless man.

We have been having people sleep on our front porch for more than 5 years. We find garbage and cigarette ashes littered on our front entrance most mornings. While we are sympathetic with their current lack of housing, we cannot risk having another situation occur as it did yesterday morning.

I cannot have educators feeling unsafe coming to work, not only does this opens up Worksafe BC issues, I will not be able to retain employees.

I cannot have families feeling unsafe; this is their safe place, and they have entrusted us to keep their child happy + healthy.

I understand that it is next to impossible to ensure that porch is not used for sleeping, but that being said, is it possible to have someone from Parks do a check on the building prior to us opening each day? I know they begin their day much earlier than employees from the Bylaw Department. Alternatively, the Police Department has suggested that cameras are installed so that the premises can be monitored to ensure it is safe to open.

I am hopeful we can work together to ensure that the childcare centre continues to provide safe care for the members of the community.

Thank you for contacting the District regarding your sustainable development service project. We appreciate you taking the time to write and appreciate your strong commitment to ocean health and environmental stewardship.

The District shares your view that recycling in parks and beach areas is important. Over the past several years, we have implemented a substantial expansion of recycling services in public spaces, with further improvements planned for this year. Plastic recycling is currently available at Dundarave, John Lawson, Millennium, Whytecliff, and Horseshoe Bay Parks. In June, plastic recycling will also be introduced at Ambleside Park.

Several of these locations additionally offer food-waste recycling, which plays a key role in reducing pressure on our landfill system and increasing the rate at which waste is diverted from landfills through composting. Our parks recycling program is complemented by an extensive streetscape recycling system, with three-stream receptacles (including plastic recycling) installed throughout business areas and at high-use transit stops across the community.

West Vancouver Council has allocated significant funding toward the expansion and operation of these public space recycling programs. The upcoming Ambleside Park expansion represents the largest single enhancement of the program to date. Hello! My name is s. 22(1) and I go to s. 22(1) in West Vancouver. My class is doing a service project based off the United Nations 17 sustainable development goals. During our unit on service projects we each pick a goal and invent, inform, or innovate to help this goal. The goal I picked was goal 14, aquatic life. "Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development" I am emailing to you because I am concerned about our ocean and the animals that live in it. Approximately 8 to 11 million metric tons of plastic enter the ocean annually, with 5.25 trillion plastic pieces estimated to be in the water. This leads to around 100,000 ocean animals being killed a year from pollution causing over 1,500 ocean species being threatened or endangered. These facts make me really worried because I love the ocean and it's really unfair how the ocean animals are not having a good quality of life because they eat and get caught in plastic. By 2050 it's estimated that there will be more plastic than fish in the ocean by weight. Our community's identity is deeply tied to the health of the Burrard Inlet and our surrounding coastlines, yet plastic waste continues to be a big threat at popular beaches like Ambleside, Dundarave, Sandy cove and Eagle Harbour beach.

I am formally requesting that the district install plastic only trash cans at these beaches I mentioned and allow me to put up these signs I made.

Plastic only bins at beaches would be specialized recycling stations for plastic items such as bottles, bags, straws, etc. They would be designed to prevent marine debris by diverting plastic waste away from landfills and the ocean. I deeply believe this would really help marine life and humans as well, by having less microplastics in the food we eat. Plastics typically take up to 600 years to fully decompose although most never fully go away. If West Vancouver could help prevent more debris it would make a big difference. At sandy cove I have seen lots of garbage because the trash can is at the top of the beach so people leave their plastic on the beach. Even if you just put a pink soft plastics in that residents already have it would be very helpful.

Dear Mayor Sager and Council,

We are writing regarding the ongoing construction project at Navy Jack adjacent to our condominium building and the increasing traffic and access issues affecting residents on 18th Street.

As previously communicated many times during the approval process for this project, residents expressed serious concerns that construction activity and operation would create significant traffic and access problems on our narrow cul-de-sac. Unfortunately, these concerns are now materializing. The blocked access also interferes with essential service vehicles, including garbage and recycling collection, and could delay emergency vehicle access when required.

We respectfully request the City implement immediate measures, including:

- Installation of clear signage prohibiting construction and contractor vehicles working on the Navy site from parking on 18th Street in front of our condominium as it impacts our parking ramp/access.

- Immediate enforcement of these restrictions, as Navy Jack construction trucks are frequently blocking resident access and creating unsafe conditions. There has been several recent incidents two of which documented in the photos below.
- Strengthening the existing and hardly visible “No Stopping” signage at the foot of 18th Street, which is routinely ignored by visitors stopping to view the ocean.
- Addition of stronger wording such as “Immediate Tow Away Zone” and increased enforcement to deter illegal stopping and parking.
- Consideration of temporary construction traffic controls for the duration of the project to protect resident access and emergency vehicle movement.

These issues will foreseeably continue once the bistro opens, with food deliveries, garbage collection and recycling pickup further increasing traffic congestion and access problems on our street.

We ask that the West Vancouver City addresses these issues immediately before conditions worsen further during construction and operation.

Thank you for your prompt attention to this matter.
